KWorld has launched a new line of computer speakers that sport a unique pyramid look.

The Kworld DP D4, DP D8, and DP D14+ have pyramid speakers that are small and claim to produce great sound as well as reduces echo.

"This unique shape avoids excess sound reflection within its case to produce clear sound layers in full range," said the company.

The D14 has pyramid-shaped satellites that can be placed on top of a desk. A small pyramid control console controls the volume and comes with a line-in and line-out ports that allows a user to hook up other devices or listen to music using a headphone.

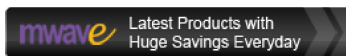
